January 21 (Note Date Change)

Program – Passport to Stitching Adventure

Join SANG in ringing in the new year -- and what a year it is shaping up to be! There will be plenty of time for stitching and learning as we countdown to hosting SCR Seminar 2020.

Stitching Passports will be available to everyone at each program. The passports

will include places to track your stitching progress, journal some stitching adventures (retreats, stitch-ins, seminars), list your UFOs (oh no! -- confession time;) and chronicle the year that promises to be ...AWESOME! Bring a list of your Works in Progress (WIP) to the meeting. You have to have at least put the item on stretcher bars or have 10 or more stitches in it in order for the project to qualify as a WIP; however, the WIP doesn't have to have been worked on recently. The stitcher with the longest list wins!

Now, I have to admit that we have somewhat of an ulterior motive in having you look through your stash. Of COURSE we want to help you get organized so you can maximize your stitching progress -- but we're also hoping that you'll run across some unstarted kits, unwanted canvas or linen, and cool stitching doodads that you don't want to dust anymore! SANG plans to have a table at the SCR Seminar 2020 Stash Sale and would love your excess stitching supplies. Particularly nice items would also be appreciated for use as Seminar Door Prizes.

February 25

Program – Mini Sampler Needle Book



Join SANG in stitching this sweet little needle book designed by our member, Karen Heller. We will be reviewing the stitches used in the needle book at our February meeting and the assembly and finishing of the needle book at our April meeting. The needle book has a mini Butterfly sampler on one side and a mini Heart sampler on the other side. The needle book has a wide variety of stitches including two drawn thread stitches, an up and down buttonhole loop closure, and a buttonhole bar binding.

The kit cost is \$20 and includes all supplies necessary to stitch and finish the needle book (32 ct Soft Ivory Belfast linen, DMC floss, Perle cotton, Kreinik and Dinky Dyes accent threads, SJ Designs beads and pearls, detailed instructions, and finishing supplies). You will need to supply 11" x 13" stretcher bars, basting thread, and your own needles. There will only be 20 kits of this project available, so sign-up promptly if





you wish to participate. Dimensions of the closed needle book are $2\frac{1}{2}$ " W x $3\frac{1}{4}$ " H.

The pilot classes will be held in the morning (9-Noon) with a break for lunch. Those who wish to help SANG prepare items for sale at Seminar 2020 Merchandise Night can return after lunch and help. Of course, anyone who does not take the pilot class in the morning is welcome to come to the afternoon work session. In January we will be continuing our pilot class series with :

Tawney Carter's The Stars at Night Felt Needle book

Date: Saturday January 11, 2020 Time: 9:00-Noon Technique: Surface Embroidery Design Area: 4 1/2"x3 3/4" Proficiency Level: All Kit Cost: \$25 Pre-Work: None Kit Contents: Felt, needles, all threads. Student Provides: Scissors and usual stitching supplies.

Make a needle book that reminds you of the night sky near Marfa Texas, where you can see the milky way nearly every night and the view of the desert goes on for miles. Each student will be given a variety of cacti and



flowers that were cut with precision dies. You will be encouraged to use as many or as few of the cut outs as you wish to create a one of a kind needle book. Not only will we will go over the basic stitches needed to complete the project but, we will also talk about using "crafty tools" to play with and embellish your needlework.

These women used the thread to create wonderful handwork that was sold for over \$19,000 which was distributed amongst 235 women. This is all possible because guild members and others help Threads of Blessing in Texas to raise scholarship funds to support the annual conference. Threads of Blessing helps over 800 women in the country.

We'll have a new outreach project in 2020, so wanted to look back on the outreach project we just closed out. In November of 2018, Joan Vanderbrink and Pat Sweet (Pictured right) were present at the dedication ceremony where 10 families were presented with the keys to their new homes, toolboxes, and a lovely stitched sampler made by members of SANG.



Trisch Moy, Faith Relations Associate was kind enough to speak to

SANG at our 2019 May luncheon. We learned all about the Habitat for Humanity mission -- working in partnership with people in need to build modest, decent and affordable houses without interest or profit. Habitat for Humanity of San Antonio brings people together to build homes, communities and hope.

Since their founding in 1976 through August of this year, Habitat has



- 1,118 affordable homes built and sold to qualified families
- 76 affordable homes rehabilitated and sold to qualified families
- Over 4,000 individuals served

Trisch talked about the incredible volunteer work at the heart Habitat. Approximately 15,500 volunteers assist in various Habitat activities each year.

Trisch so inspired SANG that we continued making samplers through 2019 -- we provided 26 samplers for 3 dedication ceremonies --job well done!


