# Program – Mini Sampler Needle Book - Part 2, Finishing

Join SANG as Karen Heller returns to teach us how to assemble and finish our beautiful needle books. Of course, it would be best if you complete the stitching prior to the

meeting -- but even if the stitching is not complete, you'll still learn important techniques that you will be able to use when finishing this and future projects.

# April 28

## **Program – Halloween Plaid Spider**



Pat Sweet will be teaching us how to create a plaid with needlepoint. The plaid is completely reversible, so you may find the technique helpful in unusual finishing situations. The method for constructing and stitching a needlepoint plaid was designed by the late Chottie Alderson, a well-known and much beloved needlework teacher from southern California. It is sometimes referred to as "Chottie's Plaid."

We will be offering two different kits:

Complete Kit: this kit will include an 8"x8" 18 count mono canvas, instructions and threads to stitch one plaid circle. The cost will be \$15

Canvas and Instructions Only: this kit will cost \$5. If you decide to use threads from your stash, here's a list of the threads used in the sample

and the completed kits so that you can select equivalent threads in whichever colorway you prefer.

DMC Perle #5: Purple 972, Black 310, Yellow 208

Kreinik #12 Braid (listed either as Lime or Chartreuse) 15

With either kit, you will need to supply 8" by 8" stretcher bars, needles and your usual stitching supplies.

Please complete the coupon on page 15 and send (along with a check made out to SANG) to Pat Sweet, no later than April 10, 2020.

This piece can be finished using a cupcake holder in the shape of a spider. Anyone participating in the plaid class can join us again in the Fall – where we will offer a spider finishing class.


# **Technique Classes**

# Make a Project Safe

All of our technique classes will be held at St. Mark United Methodist Church, 1902 Vance Jackson. Class will be held in the morning (9-Noon) with a break for lunch. Those who wish to help SANG prepare items for sale at Seminar 2020 Merchandise Night can return after lunch and help. Of course, anyone who does not take the class in the morning is welcome to come to the afternoon work session.

Time: 9:00-Noon Technique: Crafting – no needle required Proficiency Level: All Kit Cost: \$20 Pre-Work: None Kit Contents: Pre-cut foam core, duct tape, glue, instructions Student Provides: Utility scissors NOT your good ones!



Join SANG's technique class where you will learn to make a bespoke project safe for one of your needlework projects. A project safe is like a book cover that protects your piece that is on stretcher bars from getting dirty or stretched. I found instructions on making the project safe on the internet, and later learned that the American Needlepoint Guild September 2010 magazine "Needle Pointers" had an article about building an inexpensive project safe from foam core. This idea was from Judy Rager. I believe that she originated the idea, but who knows? It's a good one, and I'm sure you'll enjoy making a safe to protect your own project.

The deadline for the class has passed, remember you can bring your own roll of specialty duct tape to add personality to your project. I bought a roll of Disney Princess duct tape to make my project case. So cute! BYODT is not required – all materials needed to make your safe will be included in your kit.

#### Highlights from The Region Meeting February 22, 2020

In a very busy meeting, all the reports were discussed and many questions answered.

Of interest to all, the Group Correspondence Courses (GCCs) were presented and can be found below or in the most recent online Region Newsletter. They include "The Princess and the Pea" by Marion Scoular (A longtime favorite of this Chapter!) and 4 more choices.

The Education Benefit (\$500) and Outreach Benefit (\$300) which provide reimbursement to the Chapters will continue.

I am carrying the tickets to win a free trip to the 2021 SCR Seminar hosted by the Austin Guild in Georgetown TX. They are \$10 each or 12 for \$100.

The future Seminars are: 2022 Shreveport, LA and 2023 Houston, TX (Sugarland).

2024 will be Region Sponsored, as no Chapter has offered to host that year, and the Committee will be made up of people from the Chapters, selected by a Nominating Committee of volunteers present this weekend. A system is under discussion to share a percentage of the profits with the Chapters who provide the Chairmen.

The Heart and Hand Award winners this year will be chosen from among the nominees who best fit "The Unsung Heroes of your Chapters". As in the past few years, one of the winners will be chosen and nominated for the Gold Thread award which National awards to one person from each Region and then one of those becomes the overall winner. 
On March 20 we will meet at the Park and Ride at 1604 and IH 10 under the expressway at 9:30 am and carpool to Kerrville.


