#### **Stitchers Challenge**

Could you use a new project to help get your needle going in a new direction? Here are three great simple stitching project opportunities to show your creativity and share your stitching with others in three worthy causes:

#### First: Hearts for Hospice

These beautiful hearts are your own design and stitch choice. The hearts could be needlepoint, cross stitch, any color; whatever you can imagine. Hearts must be symmetrical in shape on your choice of material. The suggested size in 4 ½ inches across and the same from top to bottom. You stitch the heart and the Greater Kansas City Needlepoint Guild will finish the heart and provide it to a hospice center. The finished pieces are hung at the door as a respectful sign for those mourning. It is given to the family as a cherished remembrance. You could also consider donating those orphan quilt squares. Please leave a fabric margin around your stitching design for making into a finished tote bag or wheelchair bag. Your stitched pieces will be donated to World of Charity Stitching who will turn your stitching masterpieces into finished

You can give your finished stitching to any board member; however, last call for your donations will be at our scheduled meeting in January. Pieces donated for each of the charities will be featured in the newsletter the following month so challenge yourself. 
